Classroom Lessons:

Kindergarteners-2nd graders have been focusing on demonstrating the BEARS. These lessons include discussions on doing what you are supposed to be doing even if no one is watching, self-control (personal space and blurting), being a "bucket filler," and tattling vs. reporting.

Currently, our 4th-6th graders are finishing up their career and college exploration. They have been introduced to an array of careers and have begun researching careers they are individually interested in. Our 5th and 6th graders will focus on colleges as well and what level of education is required for various careers. All students will transition into what being a "bucket filler" means and empathy.

Encourage your family to find ways to be a bucket filler every day! There are some ideas here. Please ask your student to share with you their favorite part of these lessons.

- ♥ Open the door for someone
- ♥ Tell someone that they look pretty today
- ♥ Share your snack with someone

- ♥ Help someone do their job
- ♥ Ask someone to play with you on the playground
- ♥ Clean up without being asked

- ♥ Make a toy or something else for someone at school
- ♥ Hold the door for someone with their hands full

- ♥ Tell someone you like their work
- ♥ Treat others the way you would like to be treated

HUNTER EDUCATION CLASSES

January 18, 2019

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Garwood Elementary is getting ready to host our annual Hunter Education Safety class. Dates will run from February 11th through March 2nd at Garwood Elementary, and will be held every Monday & Wednesday from 3:00 to 5:15 (except Feb. 19th, Tuesday). Students need to be in attendance at each class. Instructors will be Mr. Miles, Mr. Schwalbach, and Mr. Von Till.

The class will be offered first to 12 and 11 year olds (6th, then 5th, then 4th graders). If there is additional room, 10 year olds may sign up. Registration will be on a first come first served basis as long as the fee is paid. The cost of the class is \$ 9.75. Registration will be online at Idaho Fish and Game, Home Page, (click on) Education, Hunter Education, Find the Hunter and Bowhunter-Instructor-led Garwood Course, view and sign up.

All classes will be held at Garwood Elementary in Mr. Miles' classroom. The required Field Day is tentatively set for Saturday, March 2nd, at the Idaho Fish and Game Office, Hunter Ed Building, Leopold room (2885 W. Kathleen Ave.) from 9:00 to 11:00
